#### THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

#### **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Only Vaulters qualified for the Championships as laid out by the FEI qualification criteria may be entered.

### All Athletes & Horses participating in any International competition must be registered with the FEI.

Athletes wishing to compete in an International Event must be provided with a confirmation signed by their NF. (Athletes must be entered for International competitions by their NF). Organising Committees may not accept any other entries.

After the definite entries have been made, substitutions of horses and/or competitors may only be made with the express permission of the OC. The substituted horse and/or competitor **must** be on the nominated entry list.

#### **NO-SHOWS/LATE WITHDRAWALS**

In case of withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the athlete or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. accommodation, stabling, entry fee) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show. This also refers to a later arrival in the accommodation than the date booked by the NF.

The time and date of arrival of athletes, horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate their arrival.

#### 5. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION / PARKING PASSES

A Shuttle-Service for chefs d'equipe and athletes from the airport (Cologne/Bonn, Duesseldorf (but not Düsseldorf-Weeze), Brussels or Maastricht-Aachen Airport/NL) and from each discipline's official show accommodation to the show grounds and back is provided from Monday (noon), August 17<sup>th</sup> until Sunday, August 23<sup>th</sup> 2015, daily between 06.30-00.30 hours. #### 1. ADVERTISING ON ATHLETES AND HORSES

#### 3. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

#### **MEDAL CEREMONY:**

The medal ceremonies for the Squad/Pas de Deux and Individual Championship will include only the medal winners with their winning horses. The participation in the lap of honour is obligatory for all medal winners.

Following the official medal ceremonies, the OC on behalf of the City Mayor of Aachen requests that all medallists (individuals and teams) take part at additional presenting ceremonies in the City of Aachen on the stage at the market square.

#### **CLOSING CEREMONY**

The gold medal winners are kindly invited to attend the closing ceremony.

#### 4. INSURANCES

All athletes, owners, trainers, veterinarians and their accompaniments are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees/grooms, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The OC will NOT be responsible for any damage caused by athletes, their horses, owners, NF officials, their employees/grooms or their representatives.

The FEI insures all FEI Officials, whose names are published in the FEI Officials lists, against third party liability including Judges, Course Designers, Technical Delegates, FEI Stewards, FEI Veterinary Delegates, Para Classifiers, Members of the Judges' Supervisory Panel and FEI Coaches (FEI EADCMP Veterinarians are covered under a different policy):

- Who are acting for or on behalf of the FEI as stated in the approved schedule of the Event or who are acting in the scope and course of the FEI's Business as described in the final approved schedule; and
- Who have received the status of FEI Officials at FEI Events through a qualification process.

The FEI will NOT insure:

- National officials officiating at FEI Events; and/or
- FEI Officials, who have no official function at the Event.



The insurance extended is for any liability that the FEI Official incurs to a third party, and for the costs of defending any such claim arising as a result of actions undertaken by the FEI Official in good faith (including errors and omissions) on behalf of the FEI. However, the insurance for obvious reasons does not extend to any liabilities incurred as a result of an FEI Official's dishonest, fraudulent, malicious, and/or illegal act.

Should an FEI Official become aware of an incident that he or she believes might result in a claim, that FEI Official should notify the FEI immediately and provide all of the facts known to the FEI Official. The FEI cannot guarantee the insurance coverage described above in circumstances where the FEI Official has good cause to believe that there might be a claim and does not provide such timely notice directly to the FEI.

FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarians (PTVs) (Art VRs 1005) are to have adequate professional indemnity insurance.

#### **LIABILITY**

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements.

Furthermore the OC also declines any liability for theft or other incidents. By making the definite entries each athlete declares that he/she has taken notice of the schedule and the exclusion of the liability as set out in the schedule and that the athlete explicitly agrees therewith.

www.aachen2015.com). On the show days, the show pass is valid for bus transfer to and from the show grounds with all ASEAG busses. In case of loss, a new show pass will be issued for a fee of €100.

#### 6. PROTESTS/APPEALS

All protests and appeals to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent. Each protest must be made and signed by the persons responsible and be forwarded within the time prescribed.

#### 7. MODIFICATION OF SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER, the Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Unforeseen circumstances do not include situations arising as a result of the OC altering the approved Schedule without FEI's authorisation. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

#### 8. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

#### 9. RESULTS

In order to proceed with the results publication and for qualification purposes the FEI requires results to be sent in immediately after the conclusion of the event.

Results are to be sent by e-mail to <u>Laetitia.Gillieron@fei.org</u> in the proper Excel file immediately after the event. The file can be downloaded using the following link:

### All results must include FEI Passport Registration number of horses and FEI ID numbers of Athletes.

Please note that as per Art. 109.6 (GR): OCs of International Events must inform the FEI and NFs whose teams or individuals have taken part, of the results and prize money paid to each placed Athlete and team, within five (5) days following the Event, unless otherwise specified for qualification and ranking reasons as communicated by the FEI. Failure from OCs of International Events to provide the FEI with the appropriate result(s) and/or prize money information by the aforesaid deadline and/or in the aforesaid format shall entail a warning for the first violation and thereafter a fine of CHF 1'000.- per violation.



#### **10. HORSE LORRIES**

Horse lorry of the athlete (max. one caravan or trailer per athlete) can be parked near the show grounds, **but not inside the stable area**, for the duration of the respective discipline. Electricity is supplied through installations at the assigned place. Cable is to be supplied by the owner of the lorry.

#### 11. ILLUSTRATIONS

The OC reserves the right to make use of illustrations (photographs, images, videos, etc.) made on behalf of the OC during the event or on the show grounds for their own commercial purposes (incl. digital, social media), without explicit consent of the person/athlete illustrated.

#### 12. NO MOTORISED VEHICLES AND MOTORBIKES

are allowed on the entire show grounds and the cross-country course.

#### 13. NO DOGS ALLOWED

Dogs are strictly prohibited on the entire show grounds, the stables and the cross-country course.

#### 14. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SHOW GROUND REGULATIONS

As soon as NFs have presented their entries, all athletes, also on behalf of the horse owners, as well as their employees/grooms, representatives and accompaniments are obliged, from the moment of arrival on the show grounds, to acknowledge and keep within the ALRV show ground regulations and rules of the official show schedule, to acknowledge and keep within the German Animal and Welfare Laws and Guidelines, and to behave according to the ethical principles in common practice. (on www.aachen2015.com)

Violations will be dealt with by the respective Ground Jury or Appeal Committee.

The acknowledgement of the above is to be confirmed in writing upon receipt of the show pass. As soon as NFs have presented their entries, all athletes, also on behalf of the horse owners, as well as their employees/grooms, representatives and accompaniments, are obliged, from the moment of arrival on the show grounds, to acknowledge and keep within the "Code of Conduct".

Violation of this code will be dealt with by the respective Ground Jury or Appeal Committee, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the FEI.

#### 15. MUSIC

The music rights for the competitions are the sole responsibility of the Vaulters. The OC declines any responsibility.

Music must be submitted on CD.

The forwarding agency will inform about all necessary conditions of importation. The OC will cover the costs of any customs clearance in accordance with FEI Jumping Rules, Art. 200.9.1.1.

**All customs documents** (T-1 documents) are to be submitted at the latest by the first day of competition to the entry office.

#### 2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

#### **GENERAL**

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

#### **ENTRY OF HORSES**

Every Athlete is obliged to deliver all necessary health certificates for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 (see annex Vet. I) of the actual valid form will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not belonging to the EU, a health certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II (see Annex Vet. II) of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.



Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

#### 3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

#### 1. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in vehicles suitable for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the Horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to be in compliance with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event; where necessary Athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.



#### 2. <u>VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE</u>

### PASSPORTS General Regulations Article 137

### For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events, with the exception of CNs and CIMs as outlined below.

Event's Category	FEI Passport/Recognition Card
National Events	Not compulsory
CVI1*-2*	Not compulsory for Horses from the host nation – Compulsory for Horses from the invited Nations
CVI 3*/CVIO4*	Compulsory
All Championships/Games	Compulsory

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated, or failing to meet other passport requirements including microchipping, vaccination, Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication control (Veterinary Regulations Article 1030), will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex II of the Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

Athletes will be required to write their name and counter sign next to any passport irregularity entry noted, as an acknowledgement, prior to receiving the passport and leaving the show ground. Following a warning being issued for such an irregularity the Athlete will have 30 days to correct this, failure to correct such irregularities within 30 days will result in a sanction being imposed.

Note for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union, all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations, to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

### **VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA 2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1028**

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

Exceptions to the requirement for FEI equine influenza vaccinations currently exist only for those Horses competing at CNs or CIMs where there are no national requirements for influenza vaccination in both the Event host country and the Horse's country of origin (General Regulations Article 137).

### **EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL 2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1032**

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, with regards to vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

#### HORSE INSPECTIONS 2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1033, Table 2

All Horses will be assessed for their orthopaedic fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit not to compete will be eliminated by the Ground Jury and not be permitted to continue in the competition.

### <u>LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION</u> 2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1034

Horses are not eligible to compete when a limb, or part of a limb, is hyposensitive or hypersensitive (both of which shall constitute "abnormal limb sensitivity"). Hypersensitive limbs have an excessive or abnormal reaction to palpation. Hyposensitive limbs include any alteration in sensitivity induced by a neurectomy or chemical desensitisation for as long as the alteration in sensitivity persists.

All Horses are subject to Examination under the Protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the Period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for Examination under the Protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the Examination or are subject to immediate Disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.



### 3. <u>EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME</u> (EADCMP)

2015 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VI

Within FEI Groups I & II, the Organising Committee should charge athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 towards the cost of the EADCMP, which is overseen by the FEI Veterinary Department.

#### **SAMPLING**

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures (2013 Veterinary Regulations Article 1057 and 1058).

#### **CLEAN SPORT INFORMATION**

The current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications (the EPSL) is available on the FEI Clean Sport website: <a href="www.FEICleanSport.org">www.FEICleanSport.org</a> as a PDF document, database or smart phone app. Detection times are also provided for a limited number of Controlled Medication substances where available.

Elective Testing (Art.1056) may be carried out, by Competitors for their Horses, prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances please refer to <a href="https://www.FEI.org/veterinary">www.FEI.org/veterinary</a> for information and details.

#### 4. PONIES

For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement prior to the Horse Inspection and throughout the event be subject to the requirements of the 2015 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IV.

#### 5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE (Art.1035)

Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; such information is essential to ensure that (i) the Horse's welfare remains paramount at all times and (ii) sound scientific reasoning is applied to the safety of all Horses and Athletes participating at Events. Official Veterinarians are required to report on each injured horse at an event.

#### XI. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

At a minimum, and pursuant to Article 22.3 of the ADRHAS, Organisers must provide the following at Events where the FEI informs the Organiser at least two (2) months before the Event that human anti-doping testing is scheduled to take place at the Event:

- 1. One (1) staff member able to act as point of contact and coordinator for the *Doping Control Officers* (*DCOs*) with the contact name and details of this staff member to be communicated to the *FEI* at least two (2) weeks prior to the starting date of the *Event*.
- 2. Human anti-doping facilities reasonably separated from public activity, consisting of:
  - one (1) private room exclusively dedicated for use by the *DCOs* with one (1) table, two (2) chairs, pens and paper and one (1) lockable fridge; and
  - a waiting room/area with a suitable number of chairs as well as an appropriate amount of individually sealed, non-caffeinated and non alcoholic beverages, which includes a mix of natural mineral water and soft drinks; and one (1) private and clean bathroom/toilet, adjacent or as near as possible to the *DCO* room and waiting area.
- 3. Staff members (or volunteers) of both genders, able to act as *Chaperones*. The number of *Chaperones* available to the *OC* must be communicated to the *FEI* as early as possible following receipt by the *OC* of the *Testing* plan for the *Event*. Please see the qualifications for Chaperones in the ADRHAs.

### Vaulting Competitions

#### **IMPORTANT**

The value of the  $1^{st}$  prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money distributed for the competition. The minimum number of prizes offered for each competition must be allocated on the basis of one prize for every commenced four Athletes, with a minimum of five prizes. The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (Art 127, 128)

#### **DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND INDEMNITIES**

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

The total amount of prize money shown for each competition in the schedule must be distributed.

#### Settlement of accounts per athlete

Reimbursement of prize-money will be paid out by bank transfer per competitor (not per horse resp. per horse owner) within 21 days after the European Championships. For this purpose the NF's are requested to state the bank information (name of recipient, bank name, bank code, account number, IBAN and BIC codes) of their competitors together with the online entries. In case the money transaction does not go through due to incorrect or incomplete bank information, the OC reserves the right to charge a lump sum of 80,-€ for any handling fees charged by the bank.

The Organising Committee is authorised to deduct any possible outstanding duties from the payment. Each competitor is obliged to forward the prize-money and any reimbursements to the respective horse owner.

Each competitor is requested to check and sign the final account at the accounting office before departure. The horse passports will only be handed out after the accounts have been settled.

#### **Taxation of Foreign Horse Owners, Competitors and Grooms:**

According to § 50a - Abs. 4 EStG of the German Tax Rights the OC must detain tax (withholding tax on income earned) from all accounts paid out to foreign horse owners, competitors and grooms.

The horse owners and competitors can apply for exemption of these taxes at the Central Federal Office for Finances, if the lawful requirements are met: Bundeszentralamt für Steuern, Platanenweg 33, 53225 Bonn, Germany, phone: (49) 228-4060, fax: (49) 228-4062661. An exemption of these taxes is only possible if the appropriate certificate is submitted. ### **Requirements**: The Squad Vaulting Competition consists of three tests

in two rounds (Art. 738)

- The first round consisting of the Compulsory Test and the first Freestyle

- The second round consisting of the second Freestyle.

The 12 best Squads after the first round are eligible to participate in the second round.



#### Starting order:

### According to Art. 708.1. and 708.3.1 1<sup>st</sup> round by draw (Horse's name)

The names of all starting Squad Horses are placed in a receptacle (A). Numbers equivalent to all starting Squad Horses are placed in a second receptacle (B). A Squad Horse's name is drawn from receptacle (A) and a starting place for that Squad Horse is drawn from receptacle (B). A second Squad Horse's name is drawn from receptacle (A) and a starting place for that Squad Horse and so on for all Squad Horses. In case different Squad Horses are lunged by the same longeur, there must be at least three Horses in between. This will be decided by draw and multiple starters will be drawn first.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> round:

First, a draw within the group of Squads placed 9th to 12th and then within the group of Squads placed 5th to 8th and last the group of Squads placed 1st to 4th, i.e. the four best Squads will start last.

In the case a Horse starts more than once or a longeur lunges more than one Horse, there should be at least one Horse in between. This will be decided by draw.

#### Scoring Method:

According to Art. 742-3.

The total marks for the three tests are added and then divided by 3. The result will be rounded off to the third decimal (i.e. 0.0011-0.0014 down; 0.0015-0.0019 up).

In case of equality, the higher mark from the compulsory will decide.

For Squads who did not qualify for the 2nd round, the total marks for the two tests of the first round are added and then divided by 2.

#### Requirements:

The Pas de Deux Vaulting Competition consists of two tests:

- The first round consisting of the first Freestyle
- The second round consisting of the second Freestyle.

The 12 best Pas-de-Deux after the first round are eligible to participate in the second round.

#### Starting order:

### According to Art. 708.2 and 708.3.1. 1<sup>st</sup> round by draw (Horse's name):

In case a Horse participates in the Competition more than once, the Horse's name will be drawn as many times as the Horse starts. Numbers equivalent to all starting Horses are placed in receptacle (A). Horses starting more than once and longeurs lungeing more than one Horse in the Competition are drawn first. After this all Horses will be drawn.

In case a Horse starts more than once or a longeur lunges more than one Horse, there must be at least three Horses between in the Pas-de-Deux Competition. This will be decided by draw

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> round:

by a draw, first, within the group of Pas-de-Deux placed 9th to 12th and then within the group of Pas-de-Deux placed 5th to 8th and last the group of Pas-de-Deux placed 1st to 4th, i.e. the four best Pas-de-Deux will start last.

In the case a Horse starts more than once or a longeur lunges more than one Horse, there should be at least one Horse in between. This will be decided by draw. Only one Pas-de-Deux may be on the Horse at one run-in



### Scoring Method: According to Art. 753.

The total marks from both Freestyle Tests are added and divided by 2. The result will be rounded off to the third decimal (i.e. 0.0011-0.0014 down; 0.0015-0.0019 up).

In case of equality, the higher mark from the first Test will decide.
